

FILM FESTIVAL FOR SPECIAL WEEK

A new event of interest to everyone in Indian Head who has children of school age or less, is being planned by Indian Head Home and School Club. During Education Week, which takes place in the first week in March, the Home and School Club is planning a film festival to take place on the nights of March 4 and 5 and the afternoon of March 6. All showings will be made in the town hall and an interesting program of films about child development and special problems of children will be arranged.

A committee of the Home and School Club executive made the trip to Regina last week to preview some of the films. Some suggestions, it was felt, did not meet the standards which should exist for this sort of program, and had to be discarded. On the other hand, it was agreed that certain films seen

such as "Angry Boy" would be of great interest to everyone. "Angry Boy" deals with the story of a child who was caught stealing, though the emotional problem presented could just as easily have resulted in physical illness or in retardation at school. The story of the cause of his emotional illness and his treatment and recovery from it is shown with drama and understanding.

Arrangements are being made to have available some person, with a knowledge of child development, who could answer questions which arise from the material presented. The committee in charge of arrangements is Cpl. Stan Wight, president of the Home and School Club, Mrs. Max Schreiner, and Lyle Alexander of the executive.
