

ADULTS TO AID TEST

Next week, from September 10 to 16, citizens of Indian Head will be asked to help with the project being conducted by the Canadian Mental Health Association and the Commonwealth Fund of New York.

During the week, every adult will be asked to give some of his opinions about mental health problems. Some will be asked to fill out a short questionnaire and others will be asked for personal interview.

Dr. John Cumming said today that the collection of this basic information was the beginning of the project which he hoped would result in a pooling of the knowledge and opinions of the people of Indian Head on the whole subject of mental health.

The Canadian Mental Health Association backed by the Commonwealth Fund of New York have chosen to consult the people of Indian Head as a first step toward finding out what the average Canadian considers the best way of building good mental health in his community. The questionnaire and the interviews are designed to find out what people think and feel about some mental health problems.

Dr. Cumming said that he felt that before the winter is over citizens of Indian Head will have made a most important contribution to the whole field of knowledge concerning mental health, and he concluded by saying that he was sure that Indian Head would fulfil its reputation for public-spirited cooperation by giving him and his interviewers a little of its time during the coming week.
